The Distintivo Nazista Fucilieri Assaltatori is a metal, rear-clasp badge reproduced for collectors and military history enthusiasts. It is aimed at those who collect historical military insignia, military surplus items, or tactical memorabilia for display or study.

A: The badge was instituted on 20 December 1939 by the Oberstbefehlshaber des Heeres, Generalfeldmarschall von Brauchitsch.

A: It was awarded to members of non-motorized infantry units and Gebirgsjäger units who took part in infantry assaults on at least three days of front-line combat from 1 January 1940.

Q: Is this an original wartime badge or a reproduction?

A: This item is presented as a faithful reproduction of the original World War II badge, produced for collectors and historical reference.
