Product overview

The Eagle Assist Article 5 NATO medal is a commemorative 37 mm medal for personnel and collectors who supported NATO's Eagle Assist operation after the 11 September 2001 attacks. It is aimed at veterans, memorabilia collectors, military surplus dealers, and those who display tactical or duty and police equipment.



Definition: the Eagle Assist Article 5 NATO medal recognizes service during the Eagle Assist operation (12 October 2001 – 16 May 2002) and symbolizes allied commitment and solidarity. The medal is a wearable keepsake or display item for uniforms, collections, and museum exhibits.

Main features

Key details and visual elements that define this commemorative medal.

- **Distinctive design:** Front shows the NATO star surrounded by an olive-leaf wreath, representing cooperation and peace.
- **Engraved reverse:** The back bears the title "North Atlantic Treaty Organization" and a dedication in English and French expressing service to peace and liberty.
- **Ribbon:** NATO light-blue ribbon with a central white stripe and a gold band, carrying symbolic meaning tied to Article 5 operations.
- **Article 5 clasp:** The ribbon includes the Article 5 bar representing the collective response to international security threats.
- **Size:** Supplied in a single 37 mm format suitable for display or uniform wear where permitted.
- **Collector interest:** Limited availability makes it sought after by military surplus shops, tactical collectors, and museums.

How to use / When it's useful

Quick answer: Wear the medal on formal or commemorative uniforms where regulations allow, or keep it as part of a military or tactical memorabilia collection. It also works well for display in shadow boxes, museums, or retail military surplus presentations.

In most cases, veterans, police and duty personnel, and collectors purchase this medal to mark service or to complete a display. If you plan to wear it on active uniform, check your unit or national regulations first; as a collector item it is suitable for retail sale, exhibitions, and private collections.

Care and notes

Short care instructions and practical notes to preserve the medal and comply with use rules.

- Store in a dry place and avoid prolonged exposure to sunlight to preserve ribbon colors.
- Clean gently with a soft cloth; avoid abrasive cleaners that can remove patina or damage engravings.
- Only one size is offered: 37 mm. Verify this suits your display or uniform requirements before purchase.
- Check official uniform and protocol rules before wearing on duty; this item is primarily commemorative and for collectors.



- Availability is limited—consider this when planning purchases for displays or retail inventory.

FAQ

Q: What does the Eagle Assist Article 5 NATO medal represent?

A: It recognizes service during NATO's Eagle Assist operation after 11 September 2001 and symbolizes allied solidarity in responding to international terrorism.

Q: What size is the medal?

A: The medal is supplied exclusively in a 37 mm format. Confirm this size fits your display or uniform needs before ordering.

Q: What is shown on the front and back of the medal?

A: The front features the NATO star with an olive-leaf wreath. The reverse is engraved with "North Atlantic Treaty Organization" and a dedication in English and French.

Q: How is the ribbon designed and what does it mean?

A: The ribbon is NATO light blue with a central white stripe topped by a gold band; the colors and the Article 5 bar signify peace and the collective NATO response.

Q: Can I wear this medal on my uniform?

A: Possibly, but it depends on your service branch and national uniform rules. Check local regulations before wearing this commemorative medal on official duty.

Q: Is the medal available in large quantities?

A: No. Stock is limited, so availability can be restricted for collectors, military surplus retailers, and tactical suppliers.

Tip: Choose the correct size and check uniform rules before ordering; consider browsing related medals and military surplus or tactical display items to complete a set or exhibit.
