The Spalline Metalliche Dorate Grande Uniforme Storica are historic large golden metal epaulettes made for collectors, military history enthusiasts, and period uniform restorers. They



are authentic early 20th-century uniform fittings produced by Unione Militare Roma and suited for display, collection, or historical re-enactment.

Definition: These are large, gold-plated metal shoulder boards (epaulettes) with a 16 cm plate, a decorative shield and rank markings used on historical full dress uniforms. Keywords: military surplus, tactical surplus, duty gear, police historic uniform.

Main features

Well-preserved historic epaulettes with detailed workmanship and clear rank identification, suitable for collectors and museum-style displays.

- **Material:** Gold-plated metal plate, total length 16 cm.
- **Upper stem (gambo):** Nine slightly convex scales; stem thickness 0.5 mm, length 60 mm (88 mm at lower end where it joins the shield).
- **Rank identification:** Oval shield with two raised lines indicating the rank of Tenente (Lieutenant).
- **Shield dimensions:** Oval, slightly convex, maximum width 112 mm and radius 65 mm.
- **Decorative fringe:** Gold sinusoidal fringe (cartiglio brillantato) that falls along the arm for 8 cm externally.
- **Additional detail:** A 5 cm loop with a gold cord fixed by two small gold buttons cut in a diamond point on the first, narrower scale.
- **Origin and condition:** Early 1900s production by Unione Militare Roma; noted for excellent preservation.

How to use / When it's useful

These epaulettes are primarily for display on historical uniforms, museum exhibits, or period re-enactments. They work well mounted on a restored jacket or displayed in a collection case as a documented piece of early 20th-century military attire.

Quick answer: Use them for collection, display, or historical costume rather than modern operational duty. In most cases, collectors attach them to a matching large uniform shoulder board or place them in a protective display to preserve condition.

Care and notes

Handle as an antique metal accessory: cleaning and storage protect both finish and structural details.

- Store dry and avoid prolonged exposure to moisture to protect plating.
- Clean gently with a soft, dry cloth; avoid abrasive cleaners that could remove plating.
- Not certified for modern operational use—intended as a historic uniform accessory.
- Limited quantity due to historical origin; inspect photos and ask for condition details if



needed.

Q: What is the overall length of the epaulettes?

A: The epaulettes have a total length of 16 cm for the gold-plated plate.

Q: What material are the spalline made from?

A: They are made from a gold-plated metal plate, consistent with early 20th-century uniform fittings.
