Product overview



The Croce Rossa belt with silver-colored metal buckle is a service belt designed for Croce Rossa personnel, emergency responders, and military surplus collectors who need a durable, recognizable belt for duty or display. It suits tactical, duty, police and field use where a reliable, comfortable belt is required.

Definition: a durable red polypropylene-fiber belt with a silver-colored, box-style metal buckle bearing the Croce Rossa symbol.

Main features

Built for durability and daily use, this belt balances comfort, visibility and practical design for operational environments.

- **Material:** high-strength red polypropylene fiber—lightweight, abrasion resistant and water-repellent.
- **Width:** 4 cm for stable support without bulk.
- **Length:** adjustable up to 120 cm to fit a wide range of sizes.
- **Buckle:** silver-colored stainless steel box-style buckle with the Croce Rossa emblem for secure closure.
- **Design:** practical cassette-style buckle that locks firmly for active use.

How to use / When it's useful

The belt is intended for Croce Rossa staff during operations, training or public events and also appeals to collectors of military surplus and emergency gear. It can hold small pouches or first-aid accessories and works as part of a uniform or as a high-visibility service belt.

Quick answer: use it as a duty belt for carrying lightweight tools, first-aid kits, or as a uniform accessory. In most cases, the belt is not a load-bearing device—do not use it for suspension or rescue tasks.

Care and notes

Simple care keeps the belt functional and presentable for long-term use; check the buckle and webbing regularly if used in harsh conditions.

- Clean with mild soap and water; air dry away from direct heat.
- Avoid strong solvents, oils or prolonged chemical exposure.
- Inspect the buckle and webbing for wear before each use.
- Do not use as personal protective equipment for lifting, climbing or rescue.
- Respect the Croce Rossa emblem and use the belt appropriately in operational or public contexts.



FAQ

Q: What materials is the belt made from?

A: The webbing is red polypropylene fiber, chosen for light weight, abrasion resistance and water repellence. The buckle is stainless steel with a silver finish.

Q: Is the belt adjustable to different sizes?

A: Yes. The belt adjusts up to 120 cm in length and the 4 cm width provides stability while remaining comfortable for most users.

Q: Can I attach pouches or small gear to this belt?

A: The belt is suitable for light pouches and first-aid accessories. It is not designed as a heavy load-bearing platform for tactical gear racks.

Q: Is this an official Croce Rossa-issued item?

A: The belt carries the Croce Rossa emblem on the buckle. Availability as official issued equipment depends on local Croce Rossa supply channels and policies.

Q: How should I clean and store the belt?

A: Wipe with a damp cloth and mild soap, rinse, and air dry. Store away from direct sunlight and strong chemicals to preserve color and material strength.

Q: Is this belt suitable for collectors of military surplus?

A: Yes. Its historical symbol and durable construction make it appealing for collectors of field gear, military surplus and emergency service items.

Tip: Choose the correct length and check the buckle style before purchasing; consider browsing related duty and tactical belts to find the best match for your operational needs or collection.
